SIGNS AND MIRACLES!

A miracle is a supernatural work of God, birthed with divine power, carrying a divine purpose. Miracles are everywhere in the Gospel of John! Water became wine. Blind eyes were blessed with sight. The lame were able to walk. Multitudes were fed. Even the dead rose again! Every miracle in John's Gospel is a sign that makes us wonder about who Jesus truly is. The book of John brings us a heavenly perspective filled with wonderful



revelation in every verse. Nothing in the Bible can be compared to the writing of John. He was a prophet, an evangelist, an author, an apostle, a son of thunder, and a witness to the power of Christ revealed in His miracles. The other three gospels give us the history of Christ, but John writes to unveil the mystery of Christ. John records seven of Jesus' miracles. These miracle are divine signs meant to convince us that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that we must believe in Him to be saved. To read John's gospel is to encounter Jesus in a personal and powerful way. During the season of Lent we will examine these miraculous signs to gain a deeper understanding of who Christ is for us today.

SUNDAY, MARCH 17, 2024 | FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

"Walking on Water" | John 6:16-21 (NLT)

Jesus was in the mountains praying when His disciples set off across the Sea of Galilee. While they were rowing, a strong wind started blowing, the water turned rough, and the disciples became frightened. Jesus came to them walking on the water, startling them even more. Jesus calmed their fears and revealed His divinity by traversing the stormy sea on foot and bending nature to His will. Throughout the Bible, oceans and seas were seen as dangerous and chaotic forces, and often used to represent evil itself. When God shows His power over water, He clues us in to the fact that His powers know no bounds. Jesus demonstrates His divinity by showing the same power as His Father. The disciples learned from this sign miracle that Jesus had power over natural laws and would never forsake them, even in the midst of a storm. Though they are afraid, Jesus shows that He is in control of the situation and comforts them. As believers, we know God is sovereign over all creation and is in control of all circumstances. We know that we can trust Him in any storm or situation in our lives that may produce fear, stress, or worry.
