What we believe about God and how He interacts in our lives should directly affect our behavior. In John Wesley's time there were two main theological methods that sought to explain how God works in our lives, specifically in the process of salvation: Calvinism & Arminianism. While these theological methods differ in their understanding of God's saving work in our lives, they both seek to define what we should believe about God and how we should behave in response to our beliefs. John Wesley believed Arminianism was more scripturally based and this theological line of thought shaped his beliefs and his behaviors. Maintaining a proper balance between beliefs and behavior, doctrine and discipline, faith and works has been a long-standing issue in the church. Most churches tend to emphasize one over the other (belief over behavior; or behavior over belief). John Wesley struggled with this tension all his life. United Methodist strive for balance between the two: maintaining sound doctrine and practicing holy living. We believe that what we believe about God should directly impact our behavior. Wesley pursued God with all his heart, soul, mind, and strength. And he sought to live a holy life, loving others as he loved himself. Maintaining a balance between belief and behavior is our tradition and common goal.
