"What We Believe About the Problem of Sin" | Romans 5:1-11

This week we continue in our series on our Essential Beliefs we will be looking at the sources John Wesley used to form his theological beliefs. The key to understanding Wesley's theology is found in four sources: scripture, tradition, reason, and experience. For Wesley Scripture was absolutely primary! All our beliefs are based on the divine revelation of God found in Holy Scripture. However, we can use church tradition, our intellectual reasoning, and our personal experiences to help us interpret God's Holy Word. These four sources form the Wesley quadrilateral. While John Wesley never used this exact term, these sources are seen throughout Wesley's writings to help him explain God's activity in our lives and the world. The focus of all theological thought is an attempt to explain the relationship between God and the process of salvation – how God overcomes our sin problem and provides us with eternal life. In John Wesley's day there were two mainlines of theological thought, Calvinism and Arminianism. These two thoughts both offer an explanation on how God works in our lives. John Wesley went against the major theological teaching in his day and encouraged his followers to adopt an Arminian approach to God's work of salvation in our lives and this morning we'll discover why.






