SUNDAY, MAY 5, 2024 | 6TH SUNDAY OF EASTER "What We Believe About Communion" | 1 Corinthians 11:23-29 (NLT)

What do United Methodist believe about communion? What does it represent? Why do we do it? What is a Sacrament? Who can receive the elements? Do they really become the "body" and "blood" of Christ? Why do we use grape juice rather than real wine? What does this meal really mean? Jesus gave the church this sacrament as a remembrance of His dying for sinful people so that by participation in it, the church has communion and fellowship with Him. Communion is an outward and visible sign of something inward and invisible. It's a sign of God's grace given to us to strengthen and nourish our faith. When Jesus took the bread and wine, blessed them and explained what they stood for, they became a sign and symbol of what He was about to do for us on the cross. We believe Christ is spiritually present with us during communion through the power of the Holy Spirit. Not only do we remember what God has done for us in the past, we also experience what God is doing for us now as we commune with Him. When we receive the bread and wine, we do it not just to remember Jesus, but to receive His love and salvation. Communion is a time to come to Christ with joyful thanksgiving remembering the sacrifice He made for us, fellowship with one another, celebrate His presence and recommit ourselves to His work.


