

Volunteers Need the Month of June Barrow County Food Pantry Distribution



<u>Did You Know</u>: The Barrow County Food Pantry (previously known as The Winder Food Pantry).

- Has been in operation for over 30 years.
- Practically all the food is donated by Barrow County churches, youth groups, schools, neighborhood groups, or individuals who feel called to feed the hungry.
- Last year, they were open 260 days during the year (each week Monday thru Friday) staffed completely by volunteers from 12 different churches.
- Last year, they provided over 24,000 meals to Barrow County citizens in need, along with other programs such as Feeding Families, Mobile Food Distribution, and food to the Boys & Girls Club.

The Pantry is open for 30 minutes each night (from 5:30-6:00 p.m.), and your responsibility is to fill the food vouchers that the people bring to you. Provide individual and group counseling to victims and their families using a trauma-informed approach. This full-time role also supports organizing mental health services and delivering education to promote healing, resilience, and long-term recovery.

NAVIGATOR

Serve as the primary point of contact for victims and families, guiding them through comprehensive recovery services for up to three years. This full-time role blends advocacy, coordination, and trauma-informed support to meet each individual's unique needs.
